

### **BAPTISMS**

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

### **WEDDINGS**

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

### IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

### From the Music Director

"Rejoice, you just, in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting.

I was fortunate to grow up in a family where singing came as natural as breathing. Oh, we weren't necessarily great by professional standards, but we sure knew how to make a joyful noise! Whether doing dishes or chores or gardening or any of a multitude of things that need doing on a family farm, someone in my family was always singing. And if any two of us were within earshot of each other, there'd be an attempt at harmony, often accompanied by a good deal of laughter.

In addition to a family culture of singing, we belonged to a small parish where the assembly could raise the roof with their singing and responses. We had quite a few instruments going, too. My father, a self-taught violinist, tapped his foot to keep everyone else on track; and, growing up on the front pew, it was only natural that I start playing piano at church before I was even a teenager.

What a blessing that heritage has been through the years! Life can be difficult, and sometimes I've approached Sunday with the burdens of the week weighing down my spirit. But, without fail, as I enter church and my thoughts turn to what will transpire over the next hour, my spirit lightens and the cares of the week roll away. I'm gathering with fellow believers to worship the one true God. How can I keep from singing?

While harps and lyres are kind of in short supply (any guitars out there?) we do have a church full of wonderful people with God-given voices. Whether singing is part of your daily life or someone has convinced you that you can't sing at all, I encourage you to participate fully in the song of our Assembly.

Next Sunday, our entrance hymn will be a new song – a joyful chant proclaiming, "Sing hosanna to the chosen one!" I hope you will love it as much as I do.



## THE TRADITION OF VISITING SEVEN CHURCHES ON HOLY THURSDAY

The tradition of visiting seven churches on Holy Thursday is an ancient practice, probably originating in Rome, where early pilgrims visited the seven major basilicas as penance. They are Saint John Lateran, Saint Peter, Saint Mary Major, Saint Paul-outside-the-Walls, Saint Lawrence-outside-the-Walls, Saint Sebastian-outside-the-Walls, and Holy Cross-in-Jerusalem.

Pope Boniface VIII revived the pilgrimage tradition in 1300 with the establishment of the Jubilee Year, and Rome became a center for pilgrimages. The seven churches developed as particular sites for visits. The seven areas may also be related to the historical seven deacons of Rome, whose responsibility was to minister to the poor in their region of the city. The first seven deacons in the Church were the seven assistants ordained by the Apostles to minister to the poor.




