




Tuesday Rosary Ministry




Thank you and Farewell to our Operations Manager — Deacon Ron Searls

to every corner of society.


We ask you to bless us

Fourteenth Sunday Reflections –

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul the Apostle and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's Scripture readings within today's Mass. They all experience obstacles to their ministry.

The Lord spoke to the Prophet Ezekiel (Ezekiel 2:2-5) and commissions him to prophesy to the Israelites. It will be a tough mission. For the Lord tells Ezekiel that the Israelites have rebelled against Him and they are not disposed to listen. Despite these warning from the Lord, Ezekiel called out Israel, at the Lord's command, for its infidelity and corruption.


In the second reading, Paul reminds us that we may not feel up to the mission, due to our limitations, but Our Lord makes his grace and power shine through our weakness. Paul tells the Corinthians (2 Cor. 12:7-10) that he was "given a thorn in the flesh." The "thorn" that Paul talks about could have been persecutions and trials, physical illness that was chronic, even temptations of concupiscence.

All two, Ezekiel and Paul, faced discouragement and many challenges but they preached because the Spirit of God was upon them and they felt the duty to conquer the hearts of God's people.

In the Gospel today, Jesus too, went to the synagogue in his neighborhood to preach and teach. The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that He was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6).

We too may encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Yet even in weakness, the Lord's Spirit comes upon us to spread the good news of the Kingdom of God and help the Lord to conquer the hearts of his people. Our Lord will not let our mission fail because of our weaknesses. We just have to keep trying and not get discouraged when it seems there are no results. Sometimes our message, the message of the Kingdom that we bring to others is unwelcome. But we must never give up. Even if we do things perfectly, as Jesus did in today's Gospel, the people we do this for still are incredulous.

Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). Let us ask the Lord today to be bearers of his message in our words and our example, and to help us share His Word with everyone we meet, especially the ones we love.

My Basic Rights!

On **July 4th ~ Independence Day**, we celebrate our Nation's birthday, and the rights and freedoms we enjoy as Americans. But what does the Church say about freedom and rights? The Church has always held that there are some basic rights that belong to every human being.

This notion of fundamental human rights was described by Pope John XXIII in his encyclical *Pacem in Terris* (1963). In light of the Church's teaching over the last century, some basic human rights can be consistently discerned as the most important human rights. In America, we hold in high regard the right to free speech. Along with the right comes the right to life and to housing worthy of human dignity; the right to social security; the right to respect; free enquiry; free expression; and the right to education. The right to full participation in government; the right to free exercise of one's religion; and to a free choice of a state in life. The right to a fair share of material goods and full economic rights; the right to free association and assembly; the right to emigrate and immigrate; the right to active sharing in public life; and to the legal protection of personal rights, even from the state.

Recent Popes and numerous hierarchies around the world have challenged Catholics to be protectors of human rights and to speak for those who have been deprived of them. The Church is also a prophet of human rights, in that Christians must try to deepen awareness in a fast-changing world of the new responsibilities and rights that change brings. The Church must in every way protect both the rights of the individual and the rights of the community as a whole.

The late Pope John Paul II reminded us often that with freedom comes responsibility. Freedom does not mean that we are allowed to pursue any and everything to satisfy our wants and desires, at any cost. We have to responsibly use the gift of freedom; treasure it, guard it, foster it, and use it wisely without abusing it and those around us.



Bulletin submissions are to be submitted **no later than 8 days preceding** requested publication date. Notices and full page flyers will run for a maximum of two weeks, and priority will be given to items that are date sensitive. RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.


