

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by **each godparent**. The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

I am so pleased that many people take the opportunity to stop by the church and pray during the day. I see people I don't necessarily see on Sunday. I thought it would be wonderful if the people who drop off recycling could also stop to make a little visit to Our Lord. It's a great time to say a short prayer in thanksgiving or to request the strength and grace that only God can provide. Quite a few visitors who are in Itasca for vacation or business trips also visit during the day. They come to the Sunday liturgy, as well, which is a good witness and reminder for us when we travel. Our parish website can be checked for a link to mass times across the country.



I don't know if you are aware but I hear Polish confessions every First Friday at the Polish Mission in Lombard. Between 5 and 6 of us priests hear confessions from 5:00 to 9:00 pm. Many Polish people, starting in second grade, participate in the First Friday devotion given to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque from Jesus in the Sacred Heart. Monthly confession is a wonderful way to honor the Sacred Heart. The second graders at the Polish Mission have little booklets where the priest signs off that they have been to confession for nine consecutive First Fridays. It is a wonderful way to promote the monthly confession of our sins where we receive the necessary graces to live out our daily lives. The devotion, done in honor of the Sacred Heart, promises to give the participant all the graces they need in their state of life, to establish peace in their homes, to comfort them in affliction, to be their strength during life and in death, to bestow a large blessing on all their undertakings, mercy for sinners, tepid souls to grow fervent, fervent souls to quickly mount to high perfection, the blessing of the place where a picture of his Sacred Heart is honored, that the names of those who promote the devotion will be written on His Heart never to be blotted out, and the excessive mercy of His heart and His all-powerful love will grant all those who receive holy communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in His disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments and His Divine Heart shall be their refuge in the last moment.

At St. Peter's in addition to Saturdays, I hear confessions on the second Thursdays at 7:00 pm during the Fr. John Project - when we pray Rosary and Divine Mercy, and on First Friday after the Holy Mass and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. I encourage you all to take advantage of this additional time for confession and to participate in the First Friday devotion and First Saturday devotion, as well, given to the children at Fatima. If you are unable to attend exposition after the 8:00 am Holy Mass, I encourage you to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during 24-hour perpetual Adoration.
