BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS


According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS

Fr. Slawek makes communion calls every Friday for those unable to attend Sunday mass due to illness or bad health.







If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. I would like to congratulate the 38 children from our parish who will be receiving their first Eucharist. There are two Holy Communion masses today to accommodate all of the children's family and friends wishing to share this joyous occasion with them. The children have been prepared on how to receive Jesus worthily and with great reverence. Some have brought their parents back to the worthy reception of the Eucharist. This happens quite frequently when the children are making their first confession and with how excited they are to receive Jesus for the first time. They can't wait! They know and believe with their whole hearts that Jesus Christ is coming to them. Let us pray for that same excitement each time we come to Holy Communion.



I also thought this is a wonderful opportunity to review some of the norms of the Church on the Eucharist.

The norms the Catholic Church teaches as the proper way to receive the Eucharist is kneeling and on the tongue.

The American bishops had to ask for permission for us to receive in the hand and also standing and bowing before we receive Holy Communion. These are both exceptions.

With receiving Holy Communion and celebrating the Eucharist, people often question as to when we are to bow and when we are to genuflect. We bow to the altar to honor the altar as Christ and the site where the holy sacrifice of the mass takes place. The altar actually bears the 5 wounds of Christ. Just as we are baptized to remove original sin, the altar goes through the very same process during the first mass at a new church or when an altar has been replaced. We genuflect to the tabernacle as Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is truly present there. A good example of this is when we process in for holy mass. The extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors and I bow to the altar and then genuflect to Jesus present in the tabernacle.

We do not usually acknowledge the tabernacle during the mass because the main focus is on celebration of the Eucharist and the sacrifice happening on the altar. Going back to the exceptions asked for by the American bishops, you can see why kneeling is the preferred norm for receiving Holy Communion as it shows more reverence to Jesus Christ truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

When we receive the Eucharist, our response is to say "Amen". We are not just saying we believe Jesus Christ is present, body, blood, soul and divinity. We are saying we believe everything the Catholic Church teaches. This is our faith as Catholics and should not be taken lightly. It is a great responsibility.

After Holy Communion, the sacred vessels are purified and the extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion purify their hands so no crumbs remain on their fingers. Once again this is due to the great reverence due to Jesus Christ. We must remember if Holy Communion is received in the hand to make sure to be careful on how we are handling the Sacred Host so there are no crumbs left on our hands. Jesus Christ is present in every crumb and must be consumed.

When we return to our pew we need to spend at least a few minutes in thanksgiving to Jesus Christ for coming to us in Holy Communion. He loves us so much He is willing to humble Himself to become present in the Sacred Host to nourish us in much the same way a mother nourishes her baby whenever she feeds it. Our God is an awesome God, and we have much for which to be thankful.

Once again I would like to congratulate our first communicants. May we be a good example to them of love and reverence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.


