

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. As we celebrate the feast day of the Holy Family, it brings to mind the families of today. There is so much worldly pressure on families. According to worldly standards, the parents must have very successful jobs, the children must be scholars and great athletes, and the family should be able to financially grant every wish. This creates a lot of unnecessary stress, which can create problems in the marriage and lead to separation and divorce.



There are always problems in marriages. They usually start out very small and are usually dealt with by either ignoring them or hoping everything is going to turn out fine. It usually is not considered to bring those problems and the things done each day to God. We try to do so many things on our own. Eventually, we recognize that without God, we cannot do anything.

Just as modern families have problems, so did the Holy Family and they started right away. We can see that St. Joseph was a quiet and righteous man who was more concerned about Mary than the apparent infidelity resulting in her pregnancy. He thought of her rather than the injustice against him. He didn't want the Virgin Mary stoned, which another man would feel his just due. Stoning to death was the punishment for adultery. St. Joseph was always willing to accept and follow the will of God.

The Blessed Virgin Mary trusted and lived in the divine will of God. Although she was a young pregnant girl who could have been put to death, she didn't think of herself. Rather, she ran to take care of her cousin Elizabeth, who had conceived St. John the Baptist in her old age.

St. Joseph and Blessed Mary faced life-threatening obstacles in their marriage, but with the help and guidance of God. They overcame not having a place to stay for the birth of the Messiah, the exile into Egypt, losing Jesus at the temple and so many other things of which we are not aware.

So, when marriage and family life get complicated and difficult, let us look to the Holy Family as our inspiration and example of how to get through some really tough times. Through their intercession, let us bring all of our troubles to God, knowing with God we can do all things, but without Him we can do nothing.

To begin this new year in thanksgiving, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those who volunteer to clean the church — not only for Christmas, but throughout the year. I would also like to thank Rose Ann Roll and the Art & Environment committee for their beautiful job of decorating our new church for Christmas. Also, many thanks to my cousin Andrzej Kukla and his friend Adam Piezga and his children Ania and Krzys for our new beautiful nativity scene; and also, my mom who sent the singing angel from Poland — it reminds me of when I was a little boy and would put in coins to hear her sing. I hope the children of our parish will enjoy this experience as I did. The church in total looked absolutely beautiful and added to the celebration as we joyously welcomed the birth of our Lord.

Of course, the beautiful music also played a part in our celebration. A big thank you to Roberta and the adult choir who sang during Midnight Mass and the cantors who sang at the Christmas day Masses. Thank you to all the lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and all those who played a role in helping us enter more fully into the miracle of the birth of Our Savior.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Ground Pro (Michael and Gina Pezza) and those who generously donated toward the flowers that decorated the church so beautifully.

Many thanks to our counters, who came in on a frigid morning to help count the monetary blessings received. They had to spend two extra hours counting thanks to your generosity.

Also, I am so grateful to Pete Fricano and his daughters, Allyson, Madelyn and Katelyn, who plowed and shoveled the snow and salted before the Christmas Masses. Thank you, Pete, for your generous commitment to keep our parking lot and sidewalks clean and safe throughout the winter season again. You are a blessing!
